
The Solar System and the Earth



The sun and the eight planets form a family in the sky known as the Solar System. Our Earth is a part of this Solar System. The Earth is the only planet where life is known to exist because of the presence of air and water.

The shape of the Earth





Long ago, people thought that the Earth was flat but in 1519 an explorer named Ferdinand Magellan and his companions, through their voyage, proved that the Earth is round and not flat. Later in 1916, American astronauts Neil Armstrong and Edwin Aldrin took many photos of the Earth from the Moon which again proved that the Earth is round in shape.

But the shape of the Earth is not actually round — it's shape is more like an orange- bulging in the middle and a bit flattened at the top and the bottom. The top flat point is known as the <u>North Pole</u>. The bottom flat point is the <u>South Pole</u>. An imaginary line called <u>equator</u> passes through the middle of the Earth. It divides the Earth into two equal parts called hemispheres- the Northern hemisphere and the Southern hemisphere.

Surface of the Earth

The Earth's surface is made up of land and water. The Earth looks blue from space because its major part is covered with water.





horizon coast

Horizon- The place where the sky and the land seem or appear meet is called the horizon.

Coast – The place where land and sea actually meet is called the coast.
