

Lesson - 1 Sentences

Explanation - A sentence is a group of words which makes a complete sense.

Every sentence starts with a capital letter and often ends with a full stop (.), or a question mark (?) or an exclamation mark (!) depending upon its kind.

KIND OF SENTENCES:

1. A declarative sentence says or states something and ends with a full stop (.).

Eg: - My school has a big building.

2. An interrogative sentence asks a question and ends with a question mark (?).

Eg: - When is our school reopening?

3. An imperative sentence expresses a command or a request and usually ends with a full stop.

Eg: - Please keep quiet.

4. An exclamatory sentence expresses a sudden feeling or pain and ends with an exclamation mark.

Eg: - Ah! I have hurt my finger!
